Summit Recap - Out of Chaos: A Positive and Affirming Message Regarding Violence Prevention in Allegheny County



After partnering with many of our peer organizations, YES was successful in hosting our 2nd Annual gun violence prevention summit, Out of Chaos: A Positive and Affirming Message Regarding Violence Prevention in Allegheny County. An event addressing youth trauma caused by violence, specifically gun violence, which took place at the Peterson event center on July 13th and 14th. Our students were excited to share the space with like-minded individuals who are working hard to find effective solutions to gun violence. Youth were able to experience a panel of adults and youth peers, in which they were asked difficult questions about why we believe we are dealing with these types of issues within our community. Students also connected with some of our adult leaders through a series of breakout sessions. These breakout sessions sparked discussion about personal trauma and the success that came from it, ways to process difficulty we face, and more.




Day 2 of the summit consisted of a symposium where select students were hand picked, as our youth leaders, to come together and find ways to put our words into action. Students were able to create collaborations between teens, community council members, and parent groups and come up with an innovative plan that will contribute to the decrease of gun violence in the city of Plttsburgh. As planned, with the help of city professional and community leaders, YES student leaders will implement these ideas into plans that will be put into action in Fall of 2024.
